toughest level mortal kombat collecting all the cards pokemon and scoring the most points tetris fantasy role playing games dungeons dragons rolemaster gurps while they may involve some of those aforementioned elements rarely focus on them instead playing a fantasy role playing game is much like acting out a scene from a play movie or book only without a predefined script players take on such roles as wise wizards noble knights roguish sellswords crafty hobbits greedy dwarves and anything else one can imagine and the referee allows the players don t exactly compete instead they interact with each other and with the fantasy setting the game is played orally with no game board and although the referee usually has a storyline planned for a game much of the action is impromptu performance is a major part of role playing and role playing games as a performing art is the subject of this book which attempts to introduce an appreciation for the performance aesthetics of such games the author provides the framework for a critical model useful in understanding the art especially in terms of aesthetics of role playing games the book also serves as a contribution to the beginnings of a body of criticism theory and aesthetics analysis of a mostly unrecognized and newly developing art form there are four parts the cultural structure the extent to which the game relates to outside cultural elements the formal structure or the rules of the game the social structure which encompasses the degree and quality of social interaction among players and the aesthetic structure concerned with the emergence of role playing as an art form

this book engages non digital role playing games such as table top rpgs and live action role plays in and from japan to sketch their possibilities and fluidities in a global context currently non digital rpgs are experiencing a second boom worldwide and are increasingly gaining scholarly attention for their inter media relations this study concentrates on japan but does not emphasise unique japanese characteristics as the practice of embodying an rpg character is always contingently realised the purpose is to trace the transcultural entanglements of rpg practices by mapping four arenas of conflict the tension between reality and fiction stereotypes of escapism mediation across national borders and the role of scholars in the making of role playing game practices

while many books and articles are emerging on the new area of game studies and the application of computer games to learning therapeutic military and entertainment environments few have attempted to contextualize the importance of virtual play within a broader social cultural and political environment that raises the question of the significance of work play power and inequalities in the modern world studies tend to concentrate on the content of virtual games but few have questioned how power is produced or reproduced by publishers gamers or even social media how social exclusion based on race class or gender in the virtual environment is reproduced from the real world and how actors are able to use new media to transcend their fears anxieties prejudices and assumptions the articles presented by the contributors in this volume represent cutting edge research in the area of critical game play with the hope of drawing attention to the need for more studies that are both sociological and critical
